**Summer School**

Summer school is for students at THS and TMS who have failed a course (semester or year) and must successfully complete that course in order to obtain credit or move to the next level. Upon successful completion of each course, the student will be refunded a portion of the summer school fee.

**All other fees are voluntary, depending on participation.**

**Descriptions of fees:**

- The **Textbook and Learning Resource Fee** is used for materials to support classroom instruction, such as books, calculators, instructional software licensing, and supplemental materials, to name a few. A portion of this fee is given to the buildings for replacing or purchasing textbooks and supplemental materials for additional students. The remainder of the money is used for classroom instructional materials used during the year. This money cannot be used to purchase computer hardware of any kind, but instead is used for paper, discs, printer cartridges, zip disks and other technology support materials that positively impact classroom learning.
- The **Academic Support Fee** covers costs associated with providing out-of-classroom educational opportunities for students. Examples would be travel costs, admission to exhibits or programs, and general costs associated with co-curricular activities or events.
- The **Technology Fee** covers costs associated with providing one Chromebook for each student (1 to 1 initiative).
- The **Pathways Fee** is used for materials to support the Pathways program, including materials for education and independent living.
- The **Athletic Fee**, also called a “pay to play” fee, is used to cover costs associated with these programs such as uniforms, supplies, etc. By no means do these fees cover all expenses but they do help recover some costs in offering extra-curricular programs.
- In order for an athletic fee to be credited to a student’s account, ALL OTHER REQUIRED FEES MUST BE PAID UP TO DATE. If a balance is owed for Textbook/Learning Resource/Academic Support Fees, the student is not considered to be “in good standing” and may not participate.
- **Transportation “Pay to Ride”** fees supplement a portion of the costs associated with transporting students who live less than 2.5 miles from their school. Kansas statute does not require student transportation services and state funding is not provided for students who don’t meet the minimum requirements.
